PURPOSE OF SUBMISSION

That Council take cognisance of the status of the drought in the jurisdiction area of the Cape Winelands District Municipality (CWDM).

DOEL VAN VOORLEGGING

BACKGROUND

The Western Cape is suffering from the worst drought in 105 years. The winter rainfall has been insufficient to remedy the situation leaving dam levels at critical levels.

The seasonal forecast (September – December) issued on 24 August 2017 indicates the following:

- i. Normal rainfall for the period: neither significant above or below normal rainfall projected;
- ii. Above normal maximum temperatures for the Western Cape;
- iii. Well above normal minimal temperatures.

To-date, the following municipalities have declared local states of disasters:

- i. Drakenstein Municipality: Hydrological and Agricultural Drought;
- ii. Langeberg Municipality: General state of Drought;
- iii. Witzenberg Municipality: Agricultural Drought;

The following local municipalities have informed the Disaster Management Division of the Cape Winelands District Municipality (CWDM) that they are in the process of declaring local states of disasters:

- Breede Valley Municipality: Process of declaring an agriculture drought. A
 Drought Assessment by the Department of Agriculture in the Western Cape
 Province is required before proceeding;
- ii. Stellenbosch Municipality: Declared and gazetted a Declaration of a Local State of Drought Disaster but this Council decision has not been submitted to the District Municipality for endorsement. The declaration cannot be classified by the National Disaster Management Centre until such time as the District Council and Provincial Cabinet have taken decisions on this matter. This has been communicated to the relevant officials but no information has been submitted

A letter signed by the Acting Municipal Manager, Mr F van Eck was sent to each of the local municipalities in the area of the Cape Winelands District Municipality on 15 August 2017 to request each municipality to establish drought steering committees for their respective municipal areas. The purpose of these committees was to co-ordinate and monitors the drought and to engage national and provincial departments operating in their municipal areas to develop scenario contingency plans based on their drought contingency plans.

The Disaster Management Advisory Forum members were requested to develop contingency plans for their departments in order to ensure that they can function in the event of little and no water. A letter signed by the Head: Disaster Management Centre was sent to all Disaster Management Advisory Forum members in this regard with a due date of 31 August 2017.

The Division: Disaster Management has encountered several challenges in the coordination and monitoring of this disaster. These include:

 Weekly water availability reports not been submitted by certain municipalities;

- ii. Requests made by the Disaster Management Division for establishment of Drought Steering Committees in each local municipality been ignored by most municipalities. These steering committees are vital to ensure all Provincial and National Departments located in each local municipality are aware of contingencies taken by local municipalities and they can plan accordingly;
- iii. Request for business continuity plans by municipal, provincial and national departments have not been compiled with. To-date, only plans by the Department of Health and the Drakenstein Correctional Services have been submitted;
- iv. Local municipalities are unfamiliar with the Disaster Declaration process therefore they are not ensuring the all relevant information is supplied. This will result in serious problems when the National Disaster Management Centre is required to visit the municipality to verify and classify the declaration;
- v. Lack of adequate contingency plans built around scenarios by local municipality. Little or no planning for in the event of very little water or no water;
- vi. A lack of targeted awareness campaigns and very little understanding that when radio reports state the Cape Town will run out of water by the end of December 2017, this is the same scenario for Drakenstein and Stellenbosch although these two municipalities do not have the budgets and resources to seek alternative emergency water sources;
- vii. Lack of information being received from the local municipalities in order to adequately represent the District at the Provincial Disaster Co-ordinating Committee;

COMMENT

An internal Drought Steering Committee was approved to coordinate efforts to reduce water consumption and to ensure business continuity. The Head: Disaster Management Centre chairs the said committee. Funds be made available to implement water saving measures including water recycling and water harvesting at Council premises. Expertise in this field should be brought on board to make recommendations where necessary.

The Municipality intends to co-ordinate the drought situation in the district as follows:

- a) A high level engagement be convened between the District and Local Municipalities;
- A service provider be appointed if necessary for the implementation of water saving measures and for the installation of water harvesting and water recycling technology;
- c) Proper assessments and verifications of Disaster Declarations submitted by local municipalities be undertaken;
- d) Funds on the budget be re-allocated to address the drought crisis; and
- e) Proper assessments be done to determine the drought risk reduction initiatives required;

Regular reports on the drought situation and implementation of the above will be submitted to the Executive Mayor and Mayoral Committee as well as to Council.

IMPLICATIONS

TECHNICAL

The high-risk drought areas in the district are Drakenstein and Stellenbosch due to their reliance of City of Cape Town for water. In both these municipalities as with the other municipalities, the drought response is being co-ordinated by the Water Services Departments and not their respective Disaster Management Units.

In executing our monitoring and co-ordination of the drought on a district level, we have discovered that the urgency to reduce consumption of water through behavioural changes of the community is not receiving as much attention as the technical aspects of water supply and preventing water losses within the system. More attention is required on creating awareness around saving water in order to change behaviour of communities and therefore reduce consumption.

Coverage by regional media houses, such as Eye Witness News, Primedia, is focused on the City of Cape Town and neglecting to mention all other municipalities utilising the same sources of water.

These challenges were presented at a Management Meeting held on 4 September 2017. A submission was made at the Management Meeting it was resolved that:

 A high-level meeting with the local municipalities be held at either political level or at a senior management level which would include the Municipal Managers and Director responsible for Technical Services in order to put adequate structures in place to manage the drought;

ii. A Drought Steering Committee be established within the Council to ensure business continuity in the event of little or no water, determines way for officials to save water in the work place and investigate initiatives to recycle water and harvest rainwater at Council premises

A second submission was made at the Management Meeting that was held on 18 September 2017 it was resolved that:

- i. As much information as possible be obtained from the B-Municipalities regarding the water situation in their areas.
- ii. The Cape Winelands Drought Steering Committee proceed with the identification of measures to reduce water consumption at the various offices/depots.
- iii. The services of a Service Provider be obtained to advice on measures which can be introduced to save and reuse water at the offices/depots.

During the abovementioned meeting is was advised that a process be put in place for the Declaration of a Local State of Disaster. This process should be as follows:

- i. If a local municipality's Council take a decision to declare without requiring District/Provincial support, then the Council can take the decision to declare and this decision is then published in the Provincial Gazette. This allows the Municipality's Council to adjust their budget, reprioritize their projects and procure emergency items as per their emergency procurement policy. No additional funding from the District/Province will be provided;
- ii. Should a local municipality require external support, a decision must be made by the local municipality's Council and it must be sent to the District Council for support. After receipt of the local municipality's Council decision the following process will take place:
 - a) The Cape Winelands Disaster Management Centre will do an assessment whereby the local municipality must provide the following information:
 - Background/reports of the situation;
 - Indicate what measures have been put in place to respond to the situation;
 - What initiatives have been completed i.e. awareness campaigns, projects;
 - What mitigation projects they intend completing with project plans;

- What has been reprioritized/intend to reprioritize in their own budgets.
- b) The Cape Winelands Disaster Management Centre will evaluate the information presented and make a recommendation to Council for support and provide information where the District can assist in order for the Council to make take a resolution;
- c) This resolution will be communicated with the Western Cape Disaster Management Centre and published in the Gazette. The Western Cape Disaster Management Centre will take the process forward whereby the National Disaster Management Centre will be informed and they will do the necessary assessment in order to classify the disaster. Evidence will need to be produced during the National Disaster Management Centre's assessment visit.

It is the intention of the Division: Disaster Management to hold a special Disaster Management Advisory Forum meeting to elevate this matter with all Provincial and National departments within the area of the Cape Winelands District Municipality (CWDM).

A repository for awareness materials will be developed so that the Western Cape Government and City of Cape Town's awareness materials can be shared and utilised in other municipalities. This will be a cost-effective method to create awareness of the drought crisis in the District. In general, the focus of the drought is around the City of Cape Town and similar publicity must be made in Stellenbosch and Drakenstein Municipalities as they are utilising the same water sources.

Stellenbosch Municipality: Declared and gazetted a Declaration of a Local State of Drought Disaster but this Council decision has not been submitted to the District Municipality for endorsement. The declaration cannot be classified by the National Disaster Management Centre until such time as the District Council and Provincial Cabinet have taken decisions on this matter. This has been communicated to the relevant officials but no information has been submitted

A letter signed by the Acting Municipal Manager, Mr F van Eck was sent to each of the local municipalities in the area of the Cape Winelands District Municipality on 15 August 2017 to request each municipality to establish drought steering committees for their respective municipal areas. The purpose of these committees was to co-ordinate and monitors the drought and to engage national and provincial departments operating in their municipal areas to develop scenario contingency plans based on their drought contingency plans.

The Disaster Management Advisory Forum members were requested to develop contingency plans for their departments in order to ensure that they can function in the event of little and no water. A letter signed by the Head: Disaster Management Centre was sent to all Disaster Management Advisory Forum members in this regard with a due date of 31 August 2017.

The Division: Disaster Management has encountered several challenges in the coordination and monitoring of this disaster. These include:

- Weekly water availability reports not been submitted by certain municipalities;
- ii. Requests made by the Disaster Management Division for establishment of Drought Steering Committees in each local municipality been ignored by most municipalities. These steering committees are vital to ensure all Provincial and National Departments located in each local municipality are aware of contingencies taken by local municipalities and they can plan accordingly;
- iii. Request for business continuity plans by municipal, provincial and national departments have not been compiled with. To-date, only plans by the Department of Health and the Drakenstein Correctional Services have been submitted;
- iv. Local municipalities are unfamiliar with the Disaster Declaration process therefore they are not ensuring the all relevant information is supplied. This will result in serious problems when the National Disaster Management Centre is required to visit the municipality to verify and classify the declaration;
- Lack of adequate contingency plans built around scenarios by local municipality. Little or no planning for in the event of very little water or no water;
- vi. A lack of targeted awareness campaigns and very little understanding that when radio reports state the Cape Town will run out of water by the end of December 2017, this is the same scenario for Drakenstein and Stellenbosch although these two municipalities do not have the budgets and resources to seek alternative emergency water sources;
- vii. Lack of information being received from the local municipalities in order to adequately represent the District at the Provincial Disaster Co-ordinating Committee.

COMMENT

An internal Drought Steering Committee was approved to coordinate efforts to reduce water consumption and to ensure business continuity. The Head: Disaster Management Centre chairs the said committee. Funds be made available to implement water saving measures including water recycling and water harvesting at Council premises. Expertise in this field should be brought on board to make recommendations where necessary.

The Municipality intends to co-ordinate the drought situation in the district as follows:

- a) A high level engagement be convened between the District and Local Municipalities;
- A service provider be appointed if necessary for the implementation of water saving measures and for the installation of water harvesting and water recycling technology;
- c) Proper assessments and verifications of Disaster Declarations submitted by local municipalities be undertaken;
- d) Funds on the budget be re-allocated to address the drought crisis; and
- e) Proper assessments be done to determine the drought risk reduction initiatives required;

Regular reports on the drought situation and implementation of the above will be submitted to the Executive Mayor and Mayoral Committee as well as to Council.

IMPLICATIONS

TECHNICAL

The high-risk drought areas in the district are Drakenstein and Stellenbosch due to their reliance of City of Cape Town for water. In both these municipalities as with the other municipalities, the drought response is being co-ordinated by the Water Services Departments and not their respective Disaster Management Units.

In executing our monitoring and co-ordination of the drought on a district level, we have discovered that the urgency to reduce consumption of water through behavioural changes of the community is not receiving as much attention as the technical aspects of water supply and preventing water losses within the system. More attention is required on creating awareness around saving water in order to change behaviour of communities and therefore reduce consumption.

Coverage by regional media houses, such as Eye Witness News, Primedia, is focused on the City of Cape Town and neglecting to mention all other municipalities utilising the same sources of water.

These challenges were presented at a Management Meeting held on 4 September 2017. A submission was made at the Management Meeting it was resolved that:

 A high-level meeting with the local municipalities be held at either political level or at a senior management level which would include the Municipal Managers and Director responsible for Technical Services in order to put adequate structures in place to manage the drought;

ii. A Drought Steering Committee be established within the Council to ensure business continuity in the event of little or no water, determines way for officials to save water in the work place and investigate initiatives to recycle water and harvest rainwater at Council premises

A second submission was made at the Management Meeting that was held on 18 September 2017 it was resolved that:

- i. As much information as possible be obtained from the B-Municipalities regarding the water situation in their areas.
- ii. The Cape Winelands Drought Steering Committee proceed with the identification of measures to reduce water consumption at the various offices/depots.
- iii. The services of a Service Provider be obtained to advice on measures which can be introduced to save and reuse water at the offices/depots.

During the abovementioned meeting is was advised that a process be put in place for the Declaration of a Local State of Disaster. This process should be as follows:

- i. If a local municipality's Council take a decision to declare without requiring District/Provincial support, then the Council can take the decision to declare and this decision is then published in the Provincial Gazette. This allows the Municipality's Council to adjust their budget, reprioritize their projects and procure emergency items as per their emergency procurement policy. No additional funding from the District/Province will be provided;
- ii. Should a local municipality require external support, a decision must be made by the local municipality's Council and it must be sent to the District Council for support. After receipt of the local municipality's Council decision the following process will take place:
 - a) The Cape Winelands Disaster Management Centre will do an assessment whereby the local municipality must provide the following information:
 - Background/reports of the situation;
 - Indicate what measures have been put in place to respond to the situation;
 - What initiatives have been completed i.e. awareness campaigns, projects;
 - What mitigation projects they intend completing with project plans;

- What has been reprioritized/intend to reprioritize in their own budgets.
- b) The Cape Winelands Disaster Management Centre will evaluate the information presented and make a recommendation to Council for support and provide information where the District can assist in order for the Council to make take a resolution:
- c) This resolution will be communicated with the Western Cape Disaster Management Centre and published in the Gazette. The Western Cape Disaster Management Centre will take the process forward whereby the National Disaster Management Centre will be informed and they will do the necessary assessment in order to classify the disaster. Evidence will need to be produced during the National Disaster Management Centre's assessment visit.

It is the intention of the Division: Disaster Management to hold a special Disaster Management Advisory Forum meeting to elevate this matter with all Provincial and National departments within the area of the Cape Winelands District Municipality (CWDM).

A repository for awareness materials will be developed so that the Western Cape Government and City of Cape Town's awareness materials can be shared and utilised in other municipalities. This will be a cost-effective method to create awareness of the drought crisis in the District. In general, the focus of the drought is around the City of Cape Town and similar publicity must be made in Stellenbosch and Drakenstein Municipalities as they are utilising the same water sources.
